

What is the PRMRP?

- Peer Reviewed Medical Research Program, part of the "Congressionally Directed Medical Research Program"
- Funded at \$370 million in FY24
- Includes dozens of "eligible topics" determined by statute (Defense Appropriations Act)
- "Peripheral Neuropathy" has been an eligible topic since FY21
- Conditions and funding added by the Senate only (House plays no role)
- PN would not have been added without advocacy!

• What is Advocacy?

"Any action that speaks in favor of, recommends, argues for a cause, supports or defends, or pleads on behalf of others"

• First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution

"Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and **to petition the Government for a redress of grievances**."




- Two Step Review Process for PRMRP Grants

Peer Reviewed Medical Research Program



Role of the National Institutes of Health (NIH)

- Most PN research funded through National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke (NINDS)
- NIH overall funding \$47 BILLION
- Congress does not appropriate NIH funding by disease!
- PN estimated \$236 million overall in FY25 (\$143 million in FY18)
- FPN Strategy-language in NIH funding bill and meet directly with agency.




Status of FY25 Funding

- Senate Appropriations Committee passes FY25 Defense Appropriations Act (8-1-24)
- PN included as eligible condition in PRMRP
- No floor action
- Full House approved its version on 6-28-24
- Continuing Resolution through March 14, 2025

Our Requests

- Renew designation of "Peripheral Neuropathy" in the Peer Reviewed Medical Research Program at the Department of Defense
- Protect and Grow the PRMRP (\$370 million)
- Increase overall funding for the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and specific funding for PN research.
