



STUDY PARTICIPATION OPPORTUNITY

Chemotherapy-Induced Peripheral Neuropathy Research Study



Mayo Clinic is seeking adult volunteers who have moderate to severe chemotherapy-induced peripheral neuropathy (CIPN) to participate in a research study. The purpose of this study is to assess the impact of a family caregiver massage technique that may help cancer survivors with CIPN.

You may be eligible to participate if you:

- Are 18+ years of age
- Have been treated with certain kinds of chemotherapy for any type of cancer at least 6 months ago
- Have moderate to severe symptoms of CIPN (numbness, tingling, or discomfort in the hands or feet)

Participation involves you and your family caregiver (spouse, intimate partner, friend, or other family member) being randomly assigned to one of three groups. Two groups will be assigned to use one of two different massage techniques. The third group will receive standard care and is able to participate in the massage program after completing the study. All three groups will provide us with weekly reports, and CIPN symptoms. The symptoms will be assessed using surveys at enrollment, six weeks and twelve weeks. Study participation is a total of 12 weeks. You will be compensated for your time spent in this study.
